Project New Hope, Inc. is asking for the community's help preparing for one of their busiest times of the year at Sully's Food and Baby Pantries and gearing up for 2022's high demand for food assistance. The expected increase in need and an expected drop in donations may make this season leaner than previous years. Inflation and employment factors plaguing all Americans hit especially hard for Veterans and their Families. Higher prices on everything from butter to potatoes make it difficult for families to fill their tables and even more challenging to help others. Project New Hope (PNH) asks more people to donate this year in smaller amounts to help share the joy of giving back to our Veterans.


Bill Moore, founder, and director of Project New Hope, Inc., has been connecting with local communities to help Veterans for 12 years. "We are so grateful to the Camosse Family Foundation and Eversource Energy Foundation for our donations this year for main dishes. Community members can drop off the traditional Thanksgiving dinner sides at both of our locations, Worcester and Westfield." Donations will be accepted through Thanksgiving and beyond for the entire holiday season. The Sully's Food and Baby Pantries are looking for canned or nonperishable food items such as vegetables, mashed potatoes, gravy, cranberry sauce, and stuffing mix. PNH has listed all items needed for the Food Pantries on its website.



Turkey prices have risen, not just from inflation but also from the Avian flu outbreaks, which have created shortages and higher prices. The Consumer Price Index indicates that prices for Thanksgiving staples will be higher by anywhere between 13% - 26%. Butter is expected to be 26% higher than last year. While many in need can expect a pay raise from social security and other governmental checks, it won't meet the inflation rate, and it won't begin until January of 2023. The need for assistance is now.

Many Veterans spent years of holidays overseas away from Family and friends. PNH urges the community to help them enjoy the season of giving at home with a great meal, which many Veterans struggle with regularly. This year, PNH expects to serve over 600 Veterans in the Central and Western Mass regions. This holiday season is sure to be full of chances to say "Thank You" to our Veteran community. Sully's Food and Baby Pantries from PNH provide an excellent way for everyone to show their thanks. Please consider donating today.





Proof of Veteran Status or Military Service is required, along with proof of dependents' age (copies of birth certificates are destroyed once verified). Gifts will be available for pick up at one of three office locations in Worcester, MA, Westfield, MA, or White River Junction, VT. You can select your location on the registration form.
