Dear Friends,

Reflecting on the past year, I feel gratitude for all we have accomplished and unwavering determination for our future. Project New Hope, Inc. has truly embodied the essence of a "values-driven" non-profit organization, just as we had envisioned. From the beginning, our mission has centered on providing quality services to our beloved Veterans and their families. I am proud to share that we have remained steadfast in this commitment.

I am thrilled to inform you that we invested an impressive ninety-two percent (92%) of every dollar donated to the community we serve. In 2022 alone, Project New Hope hosted five incredibly impactful Veteran Retreats. Moreover, our Sully's Food Pantry in Worcester, Westfield, and White River Junction, VT, has served 8,792 Veteran families. Our dedicated volunteers tirelessly distributed food throughout the year on four hundred and ninety-six (496) occasions. These achievements indeed highlight the immense impact we have made together.

Despite our physical presence now being limited to Worcester and Westfield, we have received numerous requests for assistance from Veterans across the United States. Many of these individuals, having discovered us online, were uncertain about where to seek support. Recently, we connected with a family in Vermont who lost their home in a tragic fire. Our external connections and collaborative efforts facilitated local services in their hometown. This heartwarming story is just one of many examples of our community outreach endeavors.

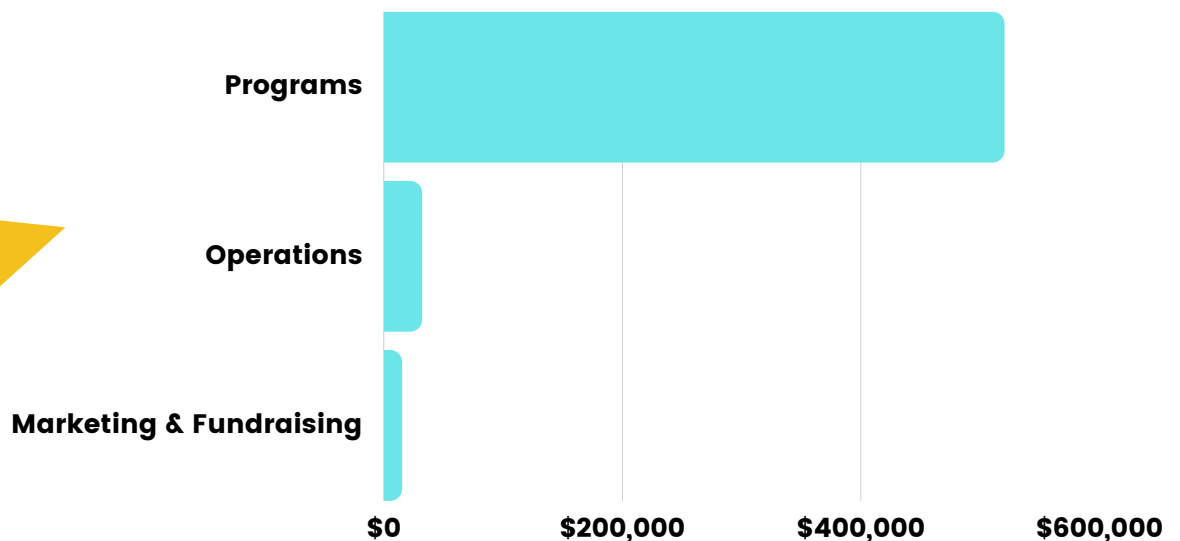
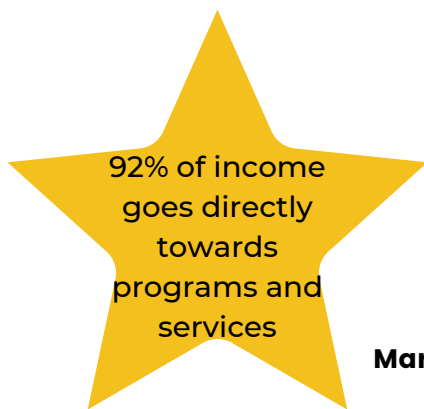
