Operation Jeepers Christmas

Operation Jeepers Christmas is one of Project New Hope Inc.’s most meaningful holiday outreach programs, created to ensure that Military and Veteran families experience the joy, dignity, and hope of the holiday season.

Through the generosity of community partners, donors, and volunteers, this program provides fully adopted Christmas gifts to families who may be facing financial hardship, medical challenges, or the long-term effects of military service.



In 2025, Operation Jeepers Christmas supported 137 Military and Veteran families, bringing holiday joy to 314 children across our Worcester and Westfield offices. Each family received thoughtfully selected gifts for their children, helping ease holiday stress and reminding them that they are seen, valued, and supported by their community.

This program reflects the heart of Project New Hope Inc.’s mission—*neighbors helping neighbors, and a community coming together to care for those who have served.*
